Please Do Not Read Before Use

A user manual for a screen that explains itself.

Most devices come with a thick manual that nobody reads. This one only needs one page and, to be honest, not even that.

What's Included A screen, a small device behind it, and some cables. That was it. No server cabinet, no license sleeve in seven languages, no bag of leftover screws.

Commissioning Step one: Hang it up. Step two: Plug it in. Step three: Connect ScreenWay to whatever you want to display the calendar, the cash register, the substitute teacher schedule. From there, the screen fills up on its own.

What You Don't Need No in-house IT department. No server room. No need to study the manual you're reading right now. If you can turn on a TV, you'll be fine here.

In everyday life You make a change at the source, and the screen updates accordingly. If a dish is finished, it disappears. If an appointment is rescheduled, it updates accordingly. At night, the screen dims automatically and is ready to go again in the morning.

If something gets stuck If the Internet goes down, the screen will keep working because it performs calculations locally. If it ever freezes, try what works for all devices: turn it off briefly, then back on. That's all the troubleshooting advice in this issue because you rarely need more than that.

That concludes the instructions. You can throw them away the screen won't hold it against you.
